## **Preparation of CuNPs**



In the synthesis of copper nanoparticles, the crude plant extract is mixed with the aqueous solution of CuSo4. The crude Neem leaf extract 2-3 ml is mixed with 50ml 0.1M CuSo4 solution and keep the solution mixture on magnetic stirrer for 20mins. The change in color of the mixture from light blue to dark green within few minutes indicates the formation of metal nanoparticles. The synthesized metal nanoparticles were centrifuge for 10min at 5000rpm





Antibacterial activity has been reported against *Escherichia coli* and a nonresistant strain of Gram-positive bacteria *Staphylococcus aureus, and* bacillus subtillus the results obtained indicate inhibition of growth of the organism due to addition of the nanoparticles
